## Dahlgren Township and Laketown Township June 6, 2024 Public Hearing for Improvements on Augusta Road

The Dahlgren Township and Laketown Township Board of Supervisors held a public hearing on June 6, 2024, to review the Feasibility Report for Augusta Road Improvements. Present from Dahlgren Township were Chairman Jeff Thompson, Supervisor Brian Gennrich, Supervisor Keith Kooiman and Clerk Mary Olson. Present from Laketown Township were Chairman Pete Parris, Supervisor Mike Klingelhutz, Supervisor Cathy Nielson and Clerk Leanne Kinze. Also present was Ron Bray, Laketown Township Engineer, Mike Courie, Township Attorney and residents from both Townships.

Chairman Parris and Chairman Thompson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Ron Bray started the discussion for the improvement of Augusta Road (see slides 4 & 5) for the area that will be improved. Mr. Bray then discussed how the road has deteriorated (slide 6). He then discussed the three options that were available for Augusta Road (see slide 8) with both boards selection Alternative #3. Ron Bray then reviewed the proposed improvements to Augusta Road (slide 9).

Mike Couri discussed the assessment process (slide 10 and 12). Thirteen residents would be impacted with the road improvement (7 on Laketown side and 6 on Dahlgren side).

The estimated cost for the project is (slide 11):

Each Township will decide how many years the assessment will be and residents will have the option to pay in full.
